SUPPORTED COMMUNITY LIVING SERVICES














PERCENTAGE OF GOALS MET

The SCL program administers the TBI-QOL on a semi-annual basis in order to measure Quality of Life and satisfaction with social roles and activies. These questions focus on the persons served perspective of how satisfied they are with their interaction with the community and ability to perform their daily routines. These results are not only used in the aggregaate, but are used at the individual person served level to identify areas to focus on for yearly goals.
